works part time at the farm. Lathwell explained, "At all levels, the staff at Rainbow 2 pulled Colin and our entire family through some really tough times

with their compassion, kindness and expertise. They became part of our family, sharing not only the tears, but amazingly, the laughter and joy. We are all better people because of the wonderful spirits of the folks who cared for Colin."

Visitors to the farm this year will find a number of other new opportunities as well, including a wider variety of fresh pre-cut trees, a brand new campfire pit area, a larger selection of hot beverages and holiday treats, an extended hay wagon ride schedule and scheduled appearances by Santa.
